### *Treasures of Delaware's Brandywine Valley*

Located on over 230-acres along the pristine Brandywine River, **Hagley Museum** is where the du Pont story begins. An example of early American industry, Hagley contains the original mills where E.I. du Pont first began producing high-quality gunpowder in the early 19<sup>th</sup> century. Visitors can tour Eleutherian Mills, the original ancestral home that housed five generations of the du Pont family. The grand mansion is surrounded by an elegant garden that was meticulously restored with great attention to historic detail.

A visit to **Winterthur** will immerse you in another time and place. Rediscover America's heritage through its unparalleled collections of antiques and Americana. Venture out over the fields and farmland to learn about the workings of a great American country estate, and wander through the breathtaking beauty of the 60-acre naturalistic Winterthur Garden.

The **Delaware Art Museum** connects people to art, offering an inclusive and essential community resource that through its collections, exhibitions, and programs generates creative energy that sustains, enriches, empowers, and inspires. The Museum is best known for its collection of British Pre-Raphaelite art, works by Wilmington-native Howard Pyle and fellow American illustrators, and urban landscapes by John Sloan.
